COMMERCIAL RIVER USE IN COLORADO

2017 Year End Report

For the second year in a row, Colorado's whitewater rafting industry hosted a record number of visitors that spent more money in the State of Colorado than ever before. Colorado's commercial rafting companies hosted a total of 578,383 rafting user days, which is an increase of 27,522 user days or a 5% increase over the 2016 season. Economic impact totaled \$193 million, a 7.2% increase over 2016.

As is commonly the case, two primary factors contributed to the record year. First, a Goldilocks snowpack and subsequent measured runoff allowed an extended season on many rivers. Rivers that are not too high during the normal runoff in June can encourage first time rafters and families to try out their local rivers with conditions that are exciting and scenic, but not too rough. Rivers that are not too low during an extended snowmelt encourages high adventure seekers to come out for a much longer portion of the season to experience bigger waves and faster flows. Use might have been even higher but was negatively impacted by rainy weather in July and August which discouraged many from making reservations.

Secondly, the continually improving economy has led to higher spending and increased visitor counts throughout Colorado. Recreation spending has increased with visitor confidence due to record stock market levels and increased home values. In addition, wildfires in Colorado last summer were not a threat to access to rivers or lodging and camping areas.

Most rivers in the state were fairly flat in use. Clear Creek showed the biggest use increase of 12,122 rafters followed next by the Upper Colorado River with 10,844 and the Green/Yampa rivers with an increase of 3,721 rafters. The Arkansas continues to be the most popular river in Colorado with a market share of 38.6% of all Colorado rafting use. Market share on the Arkansas has been declining however primarily due to increased use on Clear Creek and the Upper Colorado.

Rivers showing decreases include the Poudre and Blue Rivers. The Blue had a shortened season due to water diversions to Denver resulting in low flows. The Poudre had its second-best season ever despite the drop. All rivers in Colorado had a very good year.

Flows in southern Colorado may be impacted in 2018 if the snowfall pattern doesn't change. Snowpack in the center of the state and north is down but appears to be adequate for a full and potentially record breaking season in 2018. The continued bull stock market are also a very good indicator of continued 2018 spending.






